

Floret Table Topper

26" x 26"



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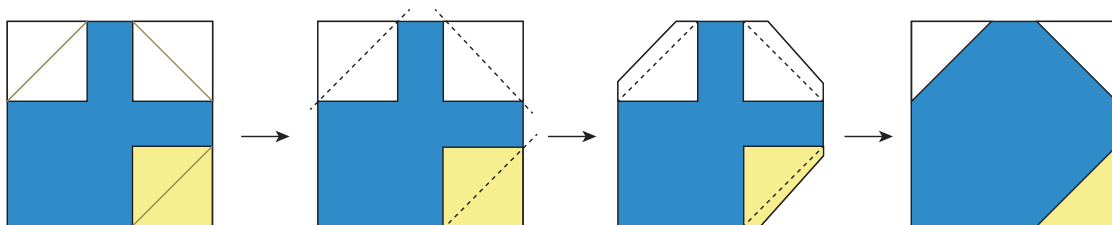
Material Requirements:

- 16 squares 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" (4 squares each from 4 fabrics).
- 16 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" of yellow fabric for flower centers.
- 9 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" for sashing squares (green in image).
- 32 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" of white background fabric.
- 12 strips 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" of white background fabric.
- 7/8 yard backing fabric.
- 1 fat quarter cut into 7 strips 2 1/2" x WOF, or 1/4 yard cut into 3 strips 2 1/2" x WOF.

All seam allowances are 1/4". "Right sides together" has been abbreviated to "RST".

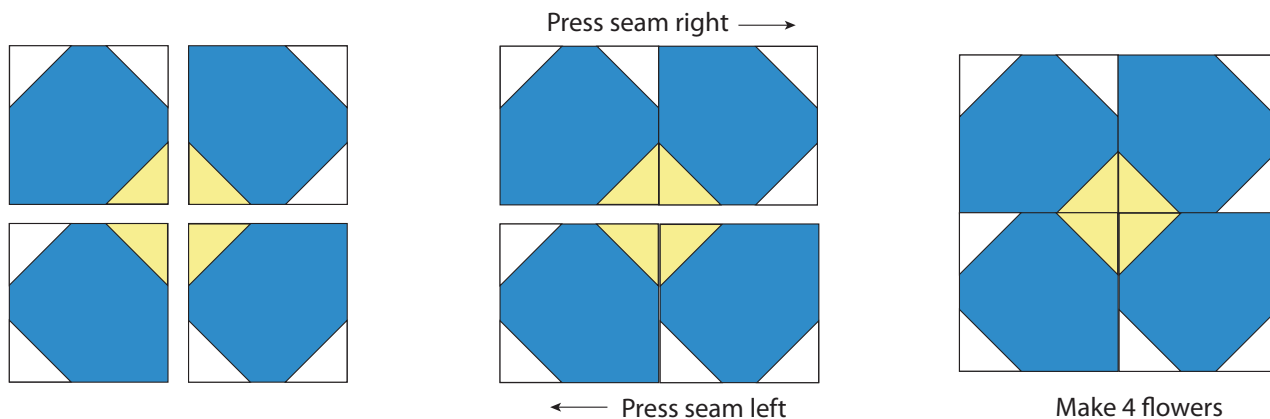
1. On the wrong side of each of the yellow and white 2 1/2" squares, draw a diagonal line in pencil from corner to corner. On a 5 1/2" square, place the white and yellow squares as shown with the pencil line facing up. Sew along the pencil lines, trim the corners leaving 1/4", and press the corners out. Repeat with the remaining 5 1/2" and 2 1/2" squares. You should have 16 finished "petals", 4 from each fabric.

pencil line



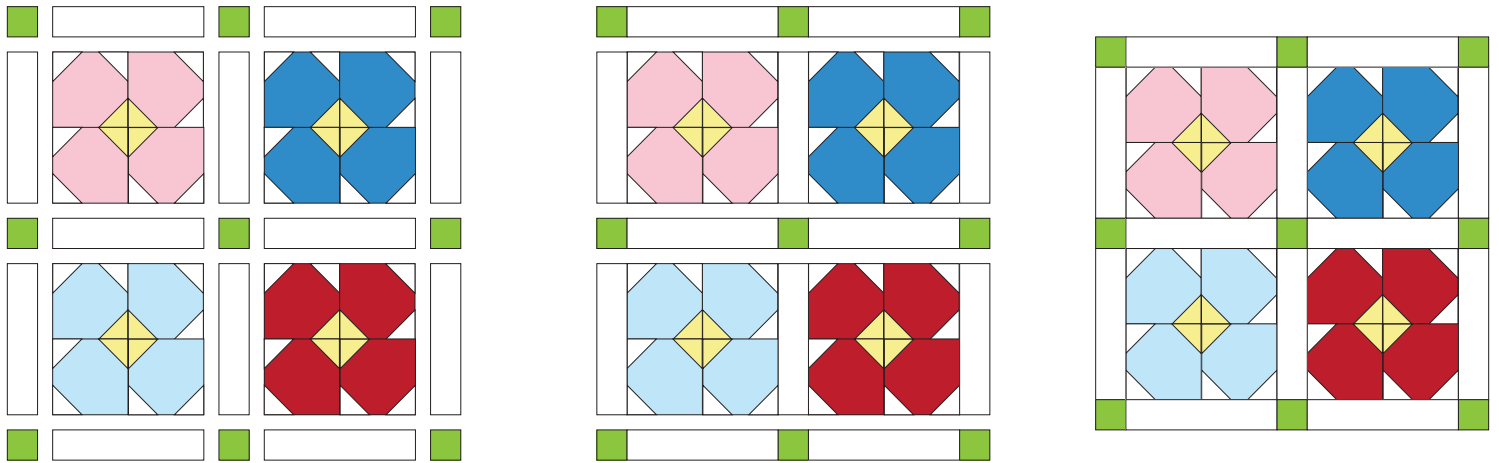

2. Sew the "petals" of each flower block RST as shown. The block should measure 10 1/2" square.

3. Layout the blocks, the squares, and the strips as shown. Sew them RST to create rows. Press the seams towards the blocks and squares. Sew the rows together.



4. Layer the top, batting, and backing, and baste and quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method. A machine binding tutorial can be found here:
